PROPER WEAR OF SVR MEMBERSHIP BADGES

In addition to cap and collar insignia, all SVR members are entitled to and should wear the SVR badge on their uniform, when participating in dedication ceremonies, parades, and at living history booths...even when these events are not under the auspices of our Order.

The caveat is that the SVR badge needs to be worn on the left breast of the uniform with and immediately to the right of either a Membership badge OR current Commander's Badge OR past Commander's Badge.

Miniature medals are not worn with regular size medals and are intended for wear with formal civilian attire. While there is no limit to the number of badges that may be worn on the SVR uniform, good taste and standards of uniformity should prevail. Less is more; most have chosen to wear no more than three medals. Wearing multiple rows of medals often works against the image of Lincoln's men that we wish to portray. Nonetheless, when two or more rows of three or four medals are worn, only the top row of medals should be fully exposed. A second row is placed underneath the row above it, so that only the drops are exposed below the drops of the medals above them."

During the National SVR events I visit each year, I see uniformed brothers wearing collections of old souvenir badges, miniature badges, various size badges, or service badges with no "Badge of the Order" worn. This irregular and improper appearance hurts our credibility, especially when the SVR participates in activities with other patriotic and public service groups. Please take time to review badge wear in Chapter V, Article 6 of the SUVCW Constitution & Regulations. A few highlights:

Miniature badge wear is reserved for dinner suits, jackets or tails. Wearing miniature badges on a Civil War uniform is incongruous.

Only the current year's National OR Dept. Encampment souvenir badge may be worn and only then with a "Badge of the Order."

War, Military Service, SVR, Souvenir, or Commemorative badges are not stand-alone. They must be worn with a "Badge of the Order."

GAR badges may only be worn if the brother is actively involved in a first person portrayal of a GAR man while the badge is being worn.

Example of SUVCW & SVR Proper Badge Position on Uniform

This photo is of the uniform of Color Sergeant Mark Hagedorn, Co. B, 71st Pennsylvania Volunteer Infantry, SVR and shows the correct placement of SUVCW and SVR badges.



Worn on Left Breast of Uniform

The Badge of the order come first, to the left of uniform buttons. Only the Badge of the Order is "Stand Alone" all others badges must be worn in conjunction with a Badge of the Order.

If awarded either the Military Service Medal or War Service Medal will be worn next. Only one of the two may be worn and neither is required. Shown here is the War Service Medal.

The medal on the right is the SVR Membership Badge. If no Military or War medal is worn then the SVR Membership Badge would be next to the SUVCW Membership badge.

The white enameled badge above the medals is the SVR Unit Citation Medallion. If it has been awarded it is worn on the uniform only, centered over other badges.

Sgt. Hagedorn shares his exact badge placements on his uniform frock coat: Align the top of medals with the bottom of second button from the top. For three medals I do three inches from center of button to edge of first medal. The Unit Citation is centered above the row badges whether you wear two, three, or four badges. You do not need to be as precise as Br. Mark, just use this photo as an example.
